The Brooklyn Branch College Scholarship

The scholarship was established for the purpose of assisting college-bound high school seniors, who reside in the borough of Brooklyn, with their expenses. Over the years, we have awarded more than \$100,000 in donations and scholarships. The scholarships normally range from \$500 to \$1000.

NAUW-BROOKLYN BRANCH COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP 2024-2025 PROGRAM YEAR

Eligibility Requirements: Applicants must:

- be a resident of Brooklyn, New York
- be a 2024 high school graduating senior
- have a cumulative GPA average of at least 3.0 or B; 80% or higher, as of the January 31, 2024 high school transcript.
- be pursuing a 4-year course of study leading to a bachelor's degree in the Fall of 2024, at an accredited four-year college or university.

Selection Process

Scholarship recipients will be selected by the members of the Education, Literacy and Scholarship Committee of NAUW – Brooklyn Branch. The committee will:

- 1. review each submitted application to determine eligibility;
- 2. evaluate eligible candidates, based upon the following application requirements: financial need, demonstrated leadership qualities, extra-curricular activities, and accomplishments.

The Scholarship Award

The selected scholarship recipients will be awarded an amount as determined by the scholarship committee. All scholarships will be distributed directly to the students after verification of registration for the specified semester (an electronic copy of your bill from the selected college, that includes your name, name and address of the school and student ID #). In the event the student is unable to attend in the specified semester, the award will be withheld, pending a written appeal from the student.

Application Requirements

Applicants must submit the following in **one electronic package**:

- 1. Completed application (must be typed)
- 2. An official high school transcript of grades as of JANUARY 31, 2024 (It must include your name, name of school, school address, ID number, and date of the transcript)
- 3. A 500-word essay about any experience you have as a community volunteer, with a description of your activities. It should also include any community service performed while at school. The essay should be double spaced in Times New Roman font, size 12
- 4. The applicant may submit, in writing, any information which would enhance the committee's decision, provided it has not already been covered.
- 5. A letter of recommendation written by the program director of the community organization where you have volunteered, or a letter of recommendation from faculty at your school.
- 6. A letter of acceptance from the college/university you plan to attend.
- 7. All materials must be received in the same packet electronically, by the deadline of **11:59 pm Friday, April 26, 2024**, to be considered.

In addition, you will be required to attend a personal interview with members of the committee. It will be conducted via Zoom on Friday, May 3rd. Please attend to a professional appearance.

^{**}If selected, the scholarship recipient will be notified by the committee via email by **Monday, May 13, 2024**. All decisions by the committee are final. No material will be returned. *Applications not submitted in their entirety will not be processed*. We will invite awardees to meet the Brooklyn Branch members on **Saturday, June 8, 2024** at the NAUW Brooklyn Branch Scholarship Luncheon.
